Service Updates - Covid-19

This fall, the Library hopes to continue to return to a greater sense of normalcy through further restoration of services. Our big step will be the return to in-person programming. The planning window for events is long and began in late spring when the viral spread was low. The Library will continue to monitor public health conditions and programs may revert to virtual, should the need arise.

For fall programs, all attendees must be registered. Guests and walkins will not be admitted. Registration will be available on an event by event basis through our web site at https://dexter.lib.mi.us/events/. Registration is a necessary precaution in order to ensure adequate social distancing. In order to make the events as widely available as possible, the Library is working with presenters and, when possible, will

In-Person Story Time Returns

In-Person Fall Story Times return to the Library. Registration for Fall Story Times begins Friday, September 10. Fall Story Times for toddlers and preschoolers will start on Monday, September 27 and run until Thursday. November 18. Children 18 months to 5 years of age may sign up for one story time session. Story Times are held on Mondays, Tuesdays, and Thursdays at 10:00 am and 11:00 am. Children under 18 months may attend, however books and activities are geared for toddlers and preschoolers. Fall Story Times for children include picture, pop-up and interactive books, flannel-board stories, songs, puppets, finger plays and other activities that encourage a love of reading. Each session lasts

approximately 30 minutes. Registration is required, parents or caregivers of children



may register on our website through our calendar of events or by calling 734-426-4477. Space is limited due to social distancing. Families must be registered and drop-ins will not be seated until pandemic conditions show significant improvement.

The Library will also continue to offer one Virtual Story Time each week. Join us on Facebook Live Wednesdays at 10:30 am when Ms. Krista will be singing familiar songs, telling stories, and demonstrating fun action rhymes each week.

am. Check in begins 15 minutes before each program. Registration is required on the Dexter District Library's website.




movement, this class is designed for the youngest dancers. Get ready to wiggle, jump and move to music, props and





The **MANHATTAN** SHORT Film Festival 2021 returns for inperson showings on September 26 at 1:30

pm, September 30 at 6:00 pm and October 3 at 1:30 pm. Over 100,000 film lovers in over 250 cities across six continents gather in cinemas, museums, libraries and universities for one purpose...to view and vote on the finalist films in the 24th Annual MANHATTAN SHORT Film Festival. Attendees receive a voting card and an official program before viewing nine short films. After viewing, participants will vote for the one film and actor they feel should win. Votes are tallied by each host venue then emailed

to MANHATTAN SHORT Film Festival's NYC headquarters. All films selected will be eligible for an Oscar nomination. Many past finalists have been nominated for an Oscar: SHOK and Bear Story from 2015, to name just two. This program is for adults. These films have not been rated.





Join us on Wednesday, September 22 at 7:00 pm when Resources for Genealogical Research in Foreign Countries comes to the Library. Once you've discovered your immigrant ancestor's home country, how will you go

about finding documents generated in the old country and how will you research generations further back? Katherine R. Willson will discuss available resources for beginning your research in foreign countries, including how to locate foreign language genealogy terms and online maps providing contextual information on shifting country borders.

Let's Go Birding on Tuesday, September 14 at 7:00 pm. A follow-up to Greg Bodker's 'Bird Watching & Birding' program, this event shows the tools needed for birding in the field and how to get the most out of your field guide. Learn about binocular selections, field guides, bird songs, birding apps and more. Greg Bodker has been a serious birder since 2006, and has led birding trips for the Michigan Audubon Society.



On Monday, September 27 at 6:30 pm the program Not Swamp Gas: The Story of the 1966 Michigan "Swamp Gas" UFO comes to the Library. In March of 1966 something mysterious was seen in the night sky over Dexter and Hillsdale, Michigan. Dexter residents described floating discs in the night sky. The Pharmacy will process insurance on site and follow up with any billing. For those without insurance coverage the flu shot will cost \$43.00. record events and make them available through our web site for a limited time following the event. For in-person programs, the Library will follow the CDC epidemic levels for Washtenaw County, found at https:// covid.cdc.gov/covid-data-tracker. All attendees who can medically tolerate masks, regardless of vaccination status, will be required to wear face coverings during programs when the epidemic spread is at Substantial or High levels. The Library highly encourages all individuals to wear masks during indoor programs. The Library will not be offering food or beverages during events. Please note, programs may be switched to virtual presentations should pandemic conditions worsen.

After the Labor Day weekend, the Library will expand service hours to pre-pandemic levels. Sunday hours will resume. The

Library will restore access to the meeting room as of October 1, if pandemic conditions permit. Reservations will be open beginning September 7 for the October 1 through December 31 timeframe. The small group study rooms will be available beginning September 13. Please note the meeting spaces will have limited availability. The Library will continue to store some furniture in these spaces. The pamphlet racks and magazine exchange will be restored and available for use. The Library has ceased quarantine of returned materials. Overdue fines will resume as of September 7, as will charges for photocopying and computer printouts.

Progress will depend on continued improvement in controlling the spread of COVID-19 in our area. Additional conditions may apply for public use of smaller indoor spaces.
