Fall Story Times Resume September 19

The Library will hold a variety of Story Times this fall, including Drop-In, Toddler and Preschool sessions.

Drop-In Fall Story Time will be held Monday and Thursday mornings at 11:00 am and will run from September 19 through November 10. No registration required for these events.

Drop-In Fall Story Time for toddlers and preschoolers will meet in the Lower Level Meeting Room. Each week, the presentation will be the same on Monday and Thursday, but will change weekly. Books and activities are geared for both the toddler and preschool age groups. Each program lasts approximately 30 minutes and include picture, pop-up and interactive books, flannel-board stories, songs, puppets, finger plays and other activities that encourage a

love of reading. Drop-In Story Times may be cancelled if public health conditions change.

The Library will also resume our small group **Toddler and Preschool Story Times** begin-

News and Notes

Programs

The Adult Department is offering a variety of recurring programs, including book discussion groups, monthly movie showings, movie discussions and a number of individual programs later this fall. Prior to the pandemic, the Library's lower level meeting room was used heavily by community groups. As pandemic conditions continue to improve, we wanted to make the community aware the meeting space is available for community use and we are currently seeing good availability. The Library's meeting room

offers tables and chairs for conversational meeting as well as a projector and screen for utilizing PowerPoint for presentations.

Millage

During this November's gubernatorial election, the Dexter District Library will be seeking renewal of it's existing operational millage. The millage was originally passed in 2005, has a six-year renewal cycle and provides 61% of annual operational income. The millage has been subject to Headlee Amendment reductions and the original 0.7 mill request has been reduced to 0.6620 mills. The reduced rate will be the subject of the renewal request. ning September 20. Registration for these sessions is required and is currently open.

Toddler Story Time will be held on Tuesday and Wednesday mornings at 10:00 am. Books and activities are geared for children 18 months to 3 years of age. Each program lasts approximately 30 minutes. The Tuesday session will be repeated on Wednesdays.

The Preschool Story Time sessions will be held on Tuesday and Wednesday mornings at 11:00 am. Books and activities are geared for children 3 to 5 years of age. Each program lasts approximately 30 minutes.

Children under 18 months may attend, however books and activities are geared for toddlers and preschoolers. Infants are welcome at Story Times with their siblings. Parents or caregivers are required to attend. Toddler and Preschool Story Times will be held in the Lower Level Meeting Room to help provide everyone with adequate social distance and address different levels of comfort in group settings.

Join us on Saturday, September 17 for two sessions of Bob-a-loo, a preschool movement program. Two sessions will be offered,



one from 9:30 to 10:15 am and a second from 10:30 to 11:15 am. Children ages five and younger can gallop like a giraffe, balance on one foot like a flamingo or sprint across the African savannah like a cheetah. Jump in with Bob-a-loo, a preschool movement-based learning program where children build heart and body strength and learn how good it feels to eat healthy. This is an out-

You could separate DNA from strawberries, help make elephant toothpaste, or crush a can with pressure. This program is geared for kids in grades K-8. No registration is required.

Fall Crafts for Preschoolers will be offered on Friday, October 14 at 10:00 am. Children age five and younger can stop by the Library and celebrate the fall season by making a variety of seasonal crafts. Decorate a leaf crown, string beads in the shape of a pumpkin, and paint a fall tree. Registration is not required.



A special Preschool Makerspace will be offered at the Library on Friday, November 11 at 10:30 am.

Children age five and younger are invited to make, try, create and play at the Library. Young children will explore a variety of stations with open-ended creative activities designed to encourage early learning. Children need an active adult partner to help them. This is a drop-in program and no registration is necessary. Stop by the Library and let your young one's creativity and imagination soar.

This is a half-hour story and craft program held in person at the Library for kids transitioning out of story time and into book club. Adults should attend this program with their children. crafts related to the theme. Registration is required and is currently open for the September meeting. Registration for future sessions opens on the day of the previous meeting. The group will meet on Thursdays, September 8, October 13 and November 10, all at 4:30 pm.

The All Star Readers Book Club for children in 3rd and 4th grade returns this fall with some great selections. All Star Readers is an independent book club for third and fourth graders. Each month we will play an icebreaker game, have a book discussion,



and do an activity related to the book we discuss. Books will be available to pick up at the Library after you register. Registration is required and is currently open for the September session. The Library's **Makerspace** for children in kindergarten through 8th grade returns this fall. Make, build, craft and explore. Participate in a variety of open-ended activities. We supply the materials and you supply the imagination. This hour long program is a drop-in event and no registration is necessary. Makerspace will be held on Tuesday, September 27 at 4:00 pm. 



Learn how to edit digital photos using Photoshop Elements. Topics such as using the organizer, fixing photos, guided mode, and photo projects will be covered.


