Cross your fingers for clear skies and no rain on Monday, April 8 from 2:00 -4:00 pm when the Library will be hosting a Drop-In Solar Eclipse Viewing Party. A near total solar eclipse will happen this day. In Dexter, the eclipse will begin at 1:57 pm with the maximum occurring at 3:13 pm. These rare events only occur when the Earth, Moon, and Sun align just right. Weather permitting, gather on the terrace behind the Library, adjacent to Mill Creek Park North, to view the progression of the eclipse. Please remember it is never safe to directly view the Sun without special

equipment. Eclipse glasses

will be available and a live stream of the eclipse will show in our Lower Level Meeting Room. Registration is not required.

The Library will also offer two sessions of a **Solar Eclipse Program presented by Longway Planetarium** on **Wednesday, March 27.** Children in grades K - 4 can register for one, hour-long session starting at 1:00 pm or at 2:30 pm. Get ready for the April 8th solar eclipse while making a

simple eclipse viewer, using a pair of sun viewing glasses (weather permitting), making a piece of eclipse art and other fun activities. Registration is required and currently open on our website.

is required and opens on Monday, March 4. Space is limited. Parents or caregivers of children may register on our website through our calendar of events, at the Youth Service Desk or by calling 734-426-4477. Children may only be registered for one 7-week session. Registration will be on a first come first served basis.

Toddler Story Times are structured for children 18 months to 3 years of age. Preschool Story Times are geared for children 3 to 5 years old. Children under 18 months may attend, however books and activities are geared for toddlers and preschoolers. Infants are welcome at story times with their siblings. Parents or caregivers are required to attend.

Each program lasts approximately 30 minutes. Our story times include picture, pop-up and interactive books, flannel-board stories, songs, puppets, finger plays and other activities that encourage a love of reading.

Children of all ages are invited to Make an Activity Bag for Spring Break on Tuesday, March 19 from 4:30 to 5:30 pm. Drop-in and put together your own craft and activity bag to take with you on your travels or use at home during spring break. Registration is not required.

Paint a Mini Canvas Craft will be offered on Saturday, March 23 at 11:00 am. Children of all ages can create their own miniature masterpiece with a little paint and a lot of imagination during this hour-long program. Registration is not required.

A Drop-In Sticker Swap will be offered on Monday, March 25 at 2:00 pm. Children of all ages love stickers. Each child will receive a notebook to decorate with stickers. Young children will explore a variety of stations with open-ended creative activities designed to encourage early learning. Children need an active adult partner to help them. This is a drop-in program for children ages 5 and younger and no registration is necessary.



KinderConcert! returns on Saturday, May 11 at 12:00 pm (noon). Children ages five and younger and their caregivers will find that

music comes alive during this 30-minute concert. Don't worry about wiggly tots sitting still for a concert - they will be encouraged to dance and move while listening to the music, hearing a story being told with musical accompaniment and learning about a special orchestral instrument. Members of the A2SO lead children on a guided introduction to the instruments of the orchestra. Registration is not required.



The Library's **Chess Club** is not just for teens. Younger children are welcome as well. If you enjoy playing chess, join us for our monthly chess games this

spring. A basic knowledge of chess gameplay is recommended. Chess sets will be provided by the Library to use during Chess Club. Registration is required and is available on our website. The Club will meet on Wednesday, April 10; Wednesday, May 1 and Wednesday, June 5, all at 6:30 pm.

The Library is now adding Blu-ray discs to our children's video collection. The selections for children's videos will be shelved interspersed with the standard DVDs. The staff will be purchasing the most popular titles in both Blu-ray and DVD when possible. We will not be replacing older titles on Blu-ray unless there is a reissue or anniversary edition.

Registration is required and is currently open for the April meeting. Super Stories will be held in the first floor Youth Programming Room on Tuesday, April 9 and Tuesday, May 14 at 4:30 pm.

In celebration of Dexter's Bicentennial, the **We Are Dexter** series continues this spring.

Director's Corner by Paul McCann



It has been a busy winter at the Library. At the February Library Board meeting, the Board accepted the Library's new Strategic Plan produced by our consultants at Fast Forward Libraries. The Plan is available on the Library's website dexter.lib.mi.us/about/strategic-plan/. The next step will be for staff to prioritize and schedule the specific tasks outlined in the document and begin working toward completion.

Magazines

Over the last year, the Library has seen many changes in the magazine industry. Whether titles migrate to digital only subscriptions, reduce the number of issues published each year, increase prices or cease publication, the challenges continue. The Library will continue to provide magazines for browsing and borrowing, but some titles may disappear in the coming years.

Blu-ray Movies

The Library is now including Blu-ray discs as part of our new additions to our video collection. On the whole,

checkout of movies has declined since the start of the pandemic. The explosion of streaming services and improved Internet availability provides an alternative to borrowing movies from the Library. The more popular titles will be duplicated in DVD and Blu-ray for the time being. We will be monitoring comparative checkout levels between the two formats. The Blu-rays in the adult collection will be shelved separately while those in the children's collection will be interfiled with standard DVDs.

In Memoria

Early in February, we were saddened to learn of the passing of our former Teen Librarian, Diane Alson. Diane worked for the Library in various roles from when we opened the current building in 2009 through 2022 and implemented the ukulele collection, the teen graphic novel collection, our teen book clubs and the Library's Teen Advisory Group (TAG.) While she recently retired, her presence will be missed at the Library.
